We all share the same goal of ridding the internet of bad actors and helping victims find justice, and Internet Works appreciates the approach you have taken as original sponsors of the Revisiting Existing Procedures On Reporting via Technology (REPORT) Act (S. 474).

We were encouraged by the Senate's passage of the bill via unanimous consent at the end of last year, and we are glad the House of Representatives has recognized the need for this critical legislation by marking it up this week in the Committee on the Judiciary.

Internet Works believes the REPORT Act is an important step in protecting children, supporting victims and holding offenders accountable, and we are urging House leadership to pass the bill.

We are committed to keeping kids safe online and will work with Congress to achieve that shared goal. We urge Congress to look at practical, actionable solutions accessible to companies of all sizes. As previously stated, we also urge Congress to provide additional funding to NCMEC so the agency has the capacity to digest the increased amount of reviewable material that platforms are obligated to provide.
